Romans 1

- 24 ...people ... do the filthy things their hearts desire, and they do shameful things with each other..
- 29 filled with all kinds of wickedness, evil, greed, and vice; they are full of jealousy, murder, fighting, deceit, and malice.
- 30 They gossip and speak evil of one another; they are hateful to God, insolent, proud, and boastful;
- they think of more ways to do evil;
- they disobey their parents;

2. How are we bad?

Romans 1

- 31 they have **no conscience**; they do not keep their promises, and they show no kindness or pity for others.
- 32 they approve of others who do them
- For those who know (Jews)
- 22 you have learned from the Law to choose what is right,
- 23 You boast about having God's law but do you bring shame on God by **breaking His law**

3. What is the result of being bad?

- Romans 1: 18 The wrath of God is being revealed from heaven against all the godlessness and wickedness of people, who suppress the truth by their wickedness
- Romans 1:32 God's law says... people who live in this way deserve death.
- Romans 5:17 It is true that through the sin of one man death began to rule because of that one man.
- Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death...

What is death?

Eph 2:1 ESV 'And you were **dead** in the trespasses and sins' and

Eph 2:4,5 ESV ⁴ But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which He loved us, ⁵ even when we were **dead** in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ--by grace you have been saved—

Gen 2:16,17 ESV ¹⁶ And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, "You may surely eat of every tree of the garden, ¹⁷ but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."

2. How do we become good?

James says in **2:18** 'show me your faith apart from your works and I will show you my faith by my works. He goes on 'you believe that God is one.. even the devils believe and shudder'.


Romans 4:18 Abraham believed and hoped, even when there was no reason for hoping, and so became "the father of many nations." Just as the scripture says, "Your descendants will be as many as the stars."

19 He was then almost one hundred years old; but his faith did not weaken when he thought of his body, which was already practically dead, or of the fact that Sarah could not have children

3. What happens when we become good?

- Romans 5:1 NIV Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have **peace** with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,
- Romans 6:4 By our baptism, then, we were buried with him and shared his death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from death by the glorious power of the Father, so also we might live a new life.
- Romans 6:12 Sin must no longer rule in your mortal bodies, so that you obey the desires of your natural self.
- Romans 6:19 says, once you presented your body as slave to impurity and lawlessness, leading to more lawlessness. Now present yourselves as slaves to righteousness leading to sanctification.





A new Law – a new Power

Romans 7:6 Now, however, we are free from the Law, because we died to that which once held us prisoners.

No longer do we serve in the old way of a written law, but in the new way of the Spirit.

- 5:9 'we have been justified by His blood'
- 5:10 'we were reconciled to God by the death of His Son'
- 5:11 'we received reconciliation',
- 6:4 'we were buried with Him'
- 6:5 we were united with Him in a death like His.
- 'we were saved'.
