1 Peter : Encouragement to stand firmin suffering and persecution

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1 PETER 4:12-13

¹² Beloved, do not think it strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened to you ¹³ but rejoice to the extent that you partake of Christ's sufferings, that when His glory is revealed, you may also be glad with exceeding joy.

2 TIMOTHY 3:12

¹² Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution...

REVELATION 2:10

¹⁰ Do not fear any of those things which you are about to suffer. Indeed, the devil is about to throw some of you into prison, that you may be tested, and you will have tribulation ten days. Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life."

And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, and they did not love their lives to the death. (Revelation 12:11)

It is a glorious act to witness for the Lord. The Lord exhorts us to be faithful unto death in Revelation 2:10. The Lord demands that we serve *at all costs* in the end times.

Examples:

- Rejection by family/relatives
- Marketplace
- Good works
- Mental anguish and/or emotional pain

ANY FORM OF THREAT OR TESTING, BE IT FOR OUR FAITH OR IN LIFE.

a) Remember who we belong to

1 Peter 1:1-2

¹ Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to the pilgrims of the Dispersion in Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, ² elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ...

Remember whose we are and who we are


b) Remember who is our living hope

1 Peter 1:3-4

³ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴ to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you.

"Peter writes of a sure hope, a hope that holds the future in the present because it is anchored in the past."

The resurrection of Jesus gave Peter a new hope. Jesus is Peter's living hope.

Remembering & knowing the person of Jesus as our living hope strengthens and sustains us in our suffering

c) Remember who keeps us

1 Peter 1:4-5

⁴ ... to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you,
⁵ who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

Verse 1:

When I fear my faith will fail Christ will hold me fast When the tempter would prevail He will hold me fast I could never keep my hold Through life's fearful path For my love is often cold He must hold me fast

Chorus:

He will hold me fast He will hold me fast For my Savior loves me so He will hold me fast

In times of suffering, know WHO is in control. God is still Sovereign.

1 Peter 2:21

²¹ For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example that you should follow His steps...

Remember that **God keeps us** by His power. On our part, we need to have faith to trust Him. d) Remember the purpose of the suffering

1 Peter 1:6-7

⁶ In this you greatly rejoice, **though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials,** ⁷ **that the genuineness of your faith**, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ.


Job 23:10 ¹⁰ ...when He has tested me, I will come forth as gold."

What could be the dross that God may want to purge & burn away in our lives as we go through the crucible of pain & fiery trials?

Why does God refine us?

It is the **process** that we go through as we grow up in the faith towards spiritual maturity and Christlikeness.

> Remembering & understanding the **purpose** of the our trials & suffering helps us respond better




