Exod 2:2: *So the woman conceived and bore a son. And when she saw that he was a beautiful child, she hid him three months.*

Will I turn aside when He wants to speak?

Exod 3:2-3:

And the Angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire from the midst of a bush. So he looked, and behold, the bush was burning with fire, but the bush was not consumed. Then Moses said, "I will now turn aside and see this great sight, why the bush does not burn."

Lesson 3

Lesson 3-1

A call comes from an Encounter **with God.**

Exod 3:4:

*So when the Lord saw that he
turned aside to look,
God called to him from the midst
of the bush and said,*

“Moses, Moses!”

Lesson 3-2

The deep fear that it will change our lives - **even cost us our lives.**

Exod 4:13:

*But he said, “O my Lord,
please send by the
hand of whomever else
You may send.”*

The key issue:
Could God use me? **Will He?**

Exod 5:22 So Moses returned to the Lord and said, “Lord, why have You brought trouble on this people? Why is it You have sent me? For since I came to Pharaoh to speak in Your name, he has done evil to this people; neither have You delivered Your people at all.”

It is OK to argue, **as long as it stops sometime** and then leads to **obedient action**.

Exod 4:13: *But he said, “O my Lord, please send by the hand of whomever else You may send.”.... (v18) So Moses went and returned to Jethro his father-in-law, and said to him, “Please let me go and return to my brethren who are in Egypt, and see whether they are still alive.”*

A need for brokenness


"I cannot do this in my own strength.

Exod 4:10: *Then Moses said to the Lord,
"O my Lord, I am not eloquent,
neither before nor since
You have spoken to Your servant;
but I am slow of speech and
slow of tongue."*

A call connects
with the Heart of God

Exod 2:24-25: *So God heard their groaning, and God remembered His covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob.*

And God looked upon the children of Israel, and God acknowledged them.



All that goes before is to **prepare** us
for our call.

Exod 2:10: *And the child grew, and she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and he became her son.*



Exod 3:1: *Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian. And he led the flock to the back of the desert, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God.*

Exod 3:12:

*So He (God) said,
“I will certainly be with you.”*


